Questions to Ask	<p>After you pick which career(s) you are interested in learning about, take some time and think of questions to ask the presenters.</p> <p>Here are some suggestions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. How do I get into this field? (Requirements, i.e., education and training) 2. What skills are necessary for this job? 3. What are your typical working hours (types of shifts, part-time or full-time) 4. What are the working conditions (workplace, interaction with co-workers, risk of injury) 5. What is the typical starting salary? Do you earn bonuses, tips or commissions? 6. What is the job market for this field? 7. What kind of employee benefits can I expect? Are there any other perks of the job?
Behavior/Etiquette	<p>Remember that the presenters are here to help you learn about career opportunities. Please be respectful of the presenters and during the presentation do <u>not</u>:</p> <p>Get up and/or walk around Talk or use your cell phone Ask questions that could make the presenter uncomfortable</p>
