### 2017-18 EOPS Program Highlights


- 1. The EOPS program served 1,382 students.
- 2. The EOPS Counselors conducted 4,646 individual appointments and 1,714 drop in appointments.
- 161 EOPS/CARE students earned their certificate, degree, and/or transferred.
- 4. EOPS students whom completed three counseling contacts demonstrated course success rate of 78% compared to 61% of a comparison group for fall 2017. The retention rates, which used the same factors to measure outcomes, were 91% for EOPS and 84% for non-EOPS students.
- 5. 149 EOPS students attended EOPS tutoring. The overall success rate of students attending EOPS/CARE/CalWORKs tutoring was 86%.




## 2018-19 EOPS State Allocation = \$1,226,510




# 2018-19 CARE State Allocation = \$188,002






### Are you satisfied with the EOPS/CARE program's hours of operation?






Which of these statements best describes food eaten in your household in the last 12 months:


In the last 12 months, were you ever hungry but didn't eat because there wasn't enough money for food?
