3. Report

A. President's Report

Given by C. Uyeki. Refer to the report on Board Docs for details.

Additional appointments: grievance review committee, hiring committees (names not listed). If you are a senator please consider additional committees that you would be willing to serve on. Most committee members serve two or at most three 3-year terms.

Bartleby link was removed from bookstore website, yay!

Lance/Kelly/Chisa met with three members of the Board of Trustees (BoT) to review 10+1 and the role of the Senate.

Senate has a budget which includes the Sustainability Coordinator and student sustainability awards. Budget needs to go through PIE.



K. Allende is joining Institutional Effectiveness Committee as Co-Chair to look at various campus plans and bring to PAC for improving Strategic Planning.

AMAC: Administration reiterated that 80/20 f2f/remote ratio for Fall 2021 is a goal and they expect varying among departments. We don't have right of assignment, that's the deans, but please help ensure that communication is happening well. If you have questions contact the Senate Executives (Chisa/Lance/Kelly) and feel free to comment on examples of both good communication and less than ideal communication on this issue.

PAC: campus is moving to Chrome River for travel reimbursements, please keep that in mind as you plan conference attendance.

GPS: There have been some mini grants awarded, see report. Consider applying for your own mini grants as well!

Program Learning Outcomes Faculty Liaisons (PLO Faculty Division Liaisons): We need to get better at assessing program-level outcomes. See all faculty email from earlier this week to express interest in taking on one of these roles – deadline is tomorrow!

K. Allende: Thanks to the Senate and those involved, and kudos for lots of LHE to noncredit program. Our program is enormous (very few full time faculty, lots of adjuncts, 2 different accrediting agencies) but not always recognized on the credit side, so this is good.

BoT: Lots of good questions/comments from the Board on Ethnic Studies and the new Area F requirement.

Fantastic presentation on DREAM, REACH, Rising Scholars, and Basic Needs

Facilities is doing lots of good work while everyone is off campus. See report in the BoT agenda for more info. Chancellor's office is encouraging colleges to align with the CA Climate Change Strategy. Pres. Scroggins has drafted a resolution for a "balanced" energy approach which includes maintaining natural gas use (e.g. our chilled water system is new-ish, expensive, and relies on natural gas). Chisa will continue to monitor progress on this, as will the sustainability folks. Public comment on this resolution might be helpful to the board as they consider the resolution.

Return to campus report from Vice Presidents (VPs):

- There have been **no** on-campus transmissions of Covid identified to date. For now county protocols continue to say that everything which can be online should be online. Please express faculty and student priorities for return to campus to the deans so that they can be shared with Instruction and Student Services leadership.
- Student services reports ~1/3 of several demographics have not returned to campus. This is a challenge and extra counselors will be allocated to encourage return to campus.

Lots of ASCCC conference registrations are open. Chisa will be presenting at Spring Plenary. Please share with your department and encourage attendance.



B. Nixon: Who is managing the release time for the PLO Liaisons? C. Uyeki: Not sure. It came through the GPS committee. She will get back to us.

M. McGuire: What is the timeline for knowing what return to campus will look like? Department by department or campus-wide information distribution? C. Uyeki: At the Senate level, we will monitor on an ongoing basis, as we do every year. Note that we don't register until July, in part because we have a summer session which affects student planning for fall. It's a complicated mix of State Health and County Health requirements as well as campus planning. E. Woolery: side negotiations are ongoing, they are trying to get a "drop dead" date set by which the decision will be made. District would like to decide as late as possible, FA would like to have it be as early as possible for faculty and for students to be able to plan.

Faculty decide in person: group work vs. flipped classroom vs. lecture, etc. Similarly, for online courses, asynchronous vs. synchronous should be faculty purview under 10+1, not fall under right of assignment. There was also concern about this in Area C.

J. Truttmann: Is this individual faculty members or department as a whole? How does this relate to DL approval? K. Rivera: We don't currently indicate sync/async on our DL amendments, maybe we should consider including that? Intent of this current resolution is the individual faculty member. J. Truttmann: what if the department doesn't approve DL? K. Rivera: Then it wouldn't matter. This is only for courses which have a department-approved DL amendment.

- E. Versace: (pro) Fall is a giant question mark. We all have a lot of uncertainty, including both faculty and students lives. Feels strongly that it is better to have a policy now so it can be communicated to students now in preparation for fall. There will be a disproportionate impact on students from equity groups, we should give our students the benefit of the doubt.
- B. Meyer: (con) Transfer students into pre-health and pre-medical programs should be on regular standards if they are taking face-to-face classes. Many receiving programs are very unhappy with the level of leniency that has been given. Department is hopeful that enough people will be vaccinated even with variants, so we can return to previous standards.
- K. Allende: (pro) Leniency is appropriate and the least we can do for students. Recall that we don't know how or what we are doing in fall, and it's even worse for our students.
- B. Lawlor: (con) Another concern of Biology department is the economics, because Chancellor's office may not be able to continue supporting. Some are worried of follow-on effects if it winds up coming out of campus budget instead of chancellor's budget.
- K. Rivera: (pro) Chancellor's office funding was extended through Calendar year, which includes fall, so budget is not a worry for fall. Agree with other pro.

Hope to task the retention and persistence committee with examining the data now. Data is still stored in WebCMS. Problem: the data was often not available in a timely fashion.

H. Duplication and Overlap Guidelines Revision

K. Allende: There is a duplication and overlap process that we follow, but a Senate-approved process was last approved in 2013. C&I reviewed the language and clarified that 60 days is within primary semesters, etc. Process and definition of appropriate overlap was clarified.

K. Rivera: Friendly amendment: "Department members" -> "Faculty" in bullet pt 3 of Philosophy. Friendly amendment accepted by P. Wolf and J. Miller.
