

Chancellor's Office Deadlines for C-ID Submission of Courses With Regard to Approved Transfer Degrees

Resolution 2013-09

Whereas, the Course Identification Numbering System (C-ID) is a supranumbering system that has been developed with the leadership of the State Academic Senate for California Community Colleges and is used to meet the legislated mandate for a common course numbering system among California's public colleges and universities; and,

Whereas, the C-ID project leadership is in the process of working with CSU partners and community colleges to assign C-ID numbers to community college offerings so as to create automatic equivalencies much as did its predecessor, the now retired Course Articulation Numbering (CAN) system; and,

Whereas, C-ID numbers have always been used in the creation of Transfer Model Curriculum (TMC) templates; and have always been required to be used in the creation of AA/AS-T degrees; and,

Whereas, the Chancellor's Office has directed colleges to submit courses for C-ID approval to the statewide C-ID faculty review group by May 31, 2013 if a C-ID descriptor is listed on an existing approved transfer degree; and the Chancellor's office has directed colleges that have existing approved transfer degrees to have all courses C-ID "approved" or C-ID "pending approval" by June 14, 2014 for all C-ID identified courses listed on the existing approved degree;

Resolved, the Academic Senate directs the Educational Design Committee (EDC) to give priority to course modifications undertaken for compliance with Chancellor's deadlines for C-ID submission and for those courses that are part of an existing (Chancellor's Office Approved) transfer degree.
