IV.	Catalog Program Maps (Courseleaf Update) – Pedro Suarez	<ul> <li>M. Sampat shared that the Committee has been working to integrate the maps into the college catalog.</li> <li>P. Suarez gave an update on Course Leaf and an overview of the current online catalog view of a program. He stated that this</li> </ul>

		project entails work on Degree Works integration to Catalog.  The goal is to assist with prospective/current or returning students and counseling locate information in one area versus multiple areas (i.e., www.mtsac.edu/guided-pathways)  Any future updates within Degree Works will update automatically in the online catalog with no manual interaction.  Completed the entry of 358 Degree Works maps into our current 2021-22 online catalog.  This integration will allow for any updates or changes from the Degree Works mappers to be automatically reflected in our online catalog reducing the issues of broken links and manual intervention to correct issues.  Phase 1 is now complete. Focus has shifted to Phase 2, which is to create links and pages in the 2022-23 online catalog.  This work is 75% complete as of March 7, 2022.
V.	ADT Website – Sara Mestas and Alana Bachor	<ul> <li>A. Bachor provided an overview of the Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT) page that is now live.</li> <li>The goal now is to ensure that students are knowledgeable of this page and the resources available to them.</li> <li>The landing page explains the difference between ADT, AAT, and AST. There are helpful links for helping students to enroll in Mt. SAC. There is also a link for Student Voices which is a podcast featuring conversations between students, alumni, and professors.</li> <li>Funding is available for 12 more podcast episodes. A. Bachor is currently in the process recruiting faculty to participate and record a podcast. If there is no interest, she seek participation from non-ADTs.         <ul> <li>A. Bachor to send S. VI.	Marketing – Sara Mestas, Michelle Sampat & John Lewallen	M. Sampat wanted to continue the conversation in regards to marketing. Some of the ideas that the team came up with last

week that can be implemented using Studio 13.

- Studio 13 is a multi-media studio in the Arts Division and coordinated by Monica Orozco.
- Guided Pathways funding was secured this year to cover the cost of student workers in Studio 13.
- The student workers assist Monica with a variety of projects such as creating videos, flyers, posters, and signs.
- The other piece of Studio 13 is that they work in conjunction with Marketing.
- o If anyone has an idea or something you would like to try, this would be a great way to pilot that.
- Some of the marketing ideas include murals or banners on the light posts that highlight programs or students at Mt. SAC.
- A. Bachor shared that she will try to work with Studio 13 to create poster-sized replicas of the ADT website to get them into the Department Chairs' Offices, Library, and other high-traffic areas.
- E. Mahmood spoke of creating a mural that aligns with the accreditation theme - "Weaving" within the Physics and Engineering Divisions of the Natural Sciences side that would show case the communities our students come from and solving problems they are interested in.
- o E. Mahmood stated that he shared this idea with Dr. Scroggins and that he most likely will work on this semester. There has been interest from other parts of campus and is open to collaborating to make this bigger.
- D. Swingle said that in her experience in Continuing Education, students do not understand what the different levels of awards are or what they need.
  - Ideally it would be helpful to the students to have something produced (online or in print) that would explain that students.
  - Students may not be fully aware what the awards mean and it we

	could really help educate students and their families.  • Michelle reminded the committee that the ADT website was a funded by a Guided Pathways mini grant.
