CONSEQUENTIAL VALIDITY - STUDENT AND FACULTY EVALUATION OF PLACEMENT

During spring semester 2012, students enrolled in READ courses were surveyed regarding their satisfaction with the reading class they were placed and enrolled in. Likewise, faculty were surveyed regarding their satisfaction with placement of students in their classes. For the study there were 462 faculty responses and 326 student responses. The results of both groups of surveys indicate a high level of consequential validity for all READ courses. The following are the results from both students who were identified as having enrolled in the course that they were "appropriately" placed into, as well as faculty perceptions of students placed.

Survey choices for faculty were:

- This student is not prepared and should have been advised to enroll in a LOWER LEVEL course.
- This student is prepared and **BELONGS** in this course.
- This student is prepared to enroll in a **HIGHER LEVEL** course.

Survey choices for students were:

- I should have been advised to enroll in a LOWER LEVEL course.
- I BELONG in this course.
- I should have been advised to enroll in a **HIGHER LEVEL** course.

As you notice, the student rating for READ 100 placement indicates that only70.37% of students surveyed felt that they were placed correctly and 29.63% felt they should have been placed higher. While this may initially be cause for concern, there is somewhat of a disconnect for two reasons. First, READ 100 is the highest placement a student can receive from the DRP. Secondly, the course is not required and a student can choose whether or not to take the class. With this in mind, we are confident of the results of the study and that we meet the consequential validity requirements.
