President's Cabinet recommended a "Holds Task Force."</li> <li>Counseling does not want actual holds on registration if Ed Plans are not complete. Many constituents at Mt. SAC can place Admission Holds on students: chemistry lab, book store, library, etc.</li> <li>Other colleges use transcript holds, not registration holds. The Holds discussion is concurrent with several different groups on campus. It was reported that students with Associate Degrees from Mt. SAC who reapply may have holds placed on registration if they do not complete orientation. Students with Associate Degrees should be exempt from</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>3.1 SSSPAC recommends J. Concerns were raised for high school students who have not completed the whole assessment process (i.e. multiple measures).</li> <li>E. Hill-Enriquez expressed frustration on behalf of AWE facilitators that high school students are not completing multiple measures. High school faculty members receive their students' placement scores; however, scores may not reflect accurate placement due to lack of multiple measures.</li> </ul>	Dorame to SSSPAC to discuss high school testing practices for dual enrollment 4.1.b J. SAC received confirmation that common assessment will begin Spring 2017 for Fall 2017 placement.</li> <li>6.2 D. Beydler emailed CAI to see if SSSPAC could have access to multiple measure questions (at the beginning of each test) and see a final version of the test. Lujan reported that counseling will move forward piloting the revised process of students completing orientation first, testing information sessions second, and assessment testing third.</li> <li>7.4.a Continuing Ed./ESL: D. Santiago reported that 500 students enrolled in ESL and more than half have placed into intermediate. New sections have been added from the waitlists. This semester, 2,300 students were served with an 84% retention rate. Non-credit Ed Plans are being revised and career goals are being added. M. Gomez-Angel reported that instead of Degree Works, an in house program is used. ABE creates initial student Ed Plans used for diploma completion.</li> <li>7.5 AmLa: E.
