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	This proposal states that the Math Department supports the following proposition regarding the use of high school performance data as multiple measure for placing Mt. SAC students into Mt. SAC math courses. Students with high school performance data will be placed into math courses based on their unweighted, cumulative high school GPA (either 11 <sup>th</sup> or 12 <sup>th</sup> ), their last math course completed, the grade received in their last math course, and any math course they are currently enrolled in. The projected implementation of this new placement system is Summer 2018.	
	Concerns: E. Hill-Enriquez, D. Rowley, and S. Ezzell shared their concerns about their departments not given the opportunity to provide input regarding the proposal to change the placement system.	
	D. Rowley shared the following: 600 plus students take LERN 81 each year. The Learning Assistance Center has been tracking self-reported high school GPAs. The results show that 23% of LERN81 students report a 2.6 – 2.9 GPA and 23% of students did not know or did not have a high school GPA.	
4. English, Literature, and Journalism Department Placement Proposal	M. Whalen distributed a handout that the English, Literature, and Journalism department adopted on the new multiple measures for placing students in composition courses.	Informational

A non-native speaker needs to speak between 700-1000 hours of instruction to attain college-level English. 165 hours of instruction is needed per high year, therefore four years of high school English instruction is a total of 660 hours to be able to speak and write at a college-level English.
