

# Concept Check: ~とおもいます/といっていました

Using short form with 「~とおもいます/といっていました」, we can form sentences that state your thoughts or quote something that someone else has said.

Note: ~とおもいます is used to express your thoughts and cannot be used to express another persons' thoughts.

## Affirmative

When using the sentence patterns ~とおもいます/といっていました, the particle と is used as a quotation particle (literally "") and is the equivalent of "that" in English.

きらさんはだ<u>いがくせいだ</u>とおもいます。

I think Kira is a college student.

きらさんは、だいが<u>くせいだといって</u>いました。

Kira said that she is a college student.

#### Negative

If the subject of the sentence is negative, rather than using 「~とおもっていません/といっていませんで した」(lit. "I'm not thinking…/They didn't say…"), instead, simply conjugate the subject into short negative form.

きらさんはうたうのがじょうず<u>じゃないとおもいます</u>。

I think that Kira isn't good at singing.

きらさんは、うたうのがじょうず<u>じゃないといっています</u>。

Kira said that she isn't good at singing.
