Harriet Tubman is an important Black American. She is an American **hero**. She was born in 1820 in the South. **Slavery** was **legal** in the South. Harriet Tubman was an **enslaved person**. Her life was very hard. In 1849, Harriet **escaped** to the North. **Slavery** was **illegal** in the North. **Escaping** was very dangerous. She **escaped** at night. Harriet needed to **hide** while going. She finally got to the North. She was **free**.

After that, Harriet started **rescuing enslaved people**. She helped **hide** many people on their way to the North. Harriet died in New York in 1913. She is an American **hero**.
