- 1. Cabinet reviewed and discussed the following information items:
 - a. Mt. SAC will be making a presentation at the 2017 Strengthening Student Success Conference entitled, "Preparing the College for Students - Not Just Preparing Students for College." Details are <u>attached</u>.
 - b. The 2017-18 Statutory COLA is estimated to be 1.56% (attached)
 - c. Cabinet highlighted the following from Vice Chancellor Pam Walker's First Friday Update (attached):
 - 1) This year's Curriculum Institute will be held July 13-15, 2017, at the Riverside Convention Center.
 - 2) The total of active Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADTs) is now 2,235.
 - d. Congress has included a Pell Grant Expansion Proposal in Federal Budget (<u>attached</u>) despite recommendations of the Trump administration to cut the Pell surplus.
 - e. Congress has also included a proposed \$2 Million increase for the National Endowment for the Arts in Federal Budget (<u>attached</u>) again despite proposed cuts in the Trump budget.
- 2. Review of the initial draft of the Education and Facilities Master Plan is now underway (attached).
- 3. Cabinet approved the <u>attached</u> response to Academic Senate Resolution on Dual Enrollment and proposed Dual Enrollment Mutual Agreement Committee (<u>attached</u>).
- 4. Chancellor Oakley's has provided the <u>attached</u> update on the Common Assessment Initiative (CAI). Generally, Cabinet saw CAI going nowhere in meeting its charge to produce a common assessment test that all colleges would be required to use in placing students in math and English. Clearly, multiple measure placement is on the horizon. A few excerpted quotes from Chancellor Oakley:
 - The use of high school transcript data, along with other student data such as GPA, has demonstrated stronger predictive value than using standardized placement exams alone.
 - CAI is a very ambitious project that has encountered challenges and delays.
 - Pending legislation such as Assembly Bill 705 would require community colleges to use high school performance information.
 - We will continue to update you on the status of the CCCAssess tools over the coming months.
- 5. Expanded PAC Agenda for the May 10th meeting is <u>attached</u>. The group will be working on the general strategy to produce the Strategic Plan for 2018-22 (<u>diagram attached</u>).
- The new California Guided Pathways Project (<u>link</u>) has accepted 20 community colleges for training in a set of six institutes (<u>description attached</u>). Members of the Mt. SAC Guided Pathways team will be invited presenters and panelists. The topics are:
