- 1. Cabinet reviewed and commented on the following information items:
 - a. The Administrative Services Quarterly Report is now available. (See attached.)
 - b.A recent article, "For Community Colleges Free College Has Its Costs" (attached) makes several points:
 - Community colleges are seeing an influx of students who may need more guidance than their higher-income peers.
 - Some higher ed experts say promise programs underscore that need without necessarily providing the additional resources to cover it.
 - 13 states across the country have one [a Free College program]. Another seven states have some legislative activity on the topic.
 - "They need more support for emergency grants, child care & transportation." Martha Kanter, exec director of College Promise Campaign.
 - 50% indicated in response to a separate question that their program had financial sustainability concerns.
 - Equity concerns: students from low-income families can use a Pell Grant to cover tuition and need help affording other aspects of college.
 - c. The Full and Fair Funding Coalition announced (<u>see attached</u>) that it was pulling its initiative (<u>link</u>) from November 2020 ballot to avoid conflict with the split roll property tax initiative (<u>link</u>).

Joining Barbara was Antonio Bangloy, Director of Enterprise Applications Systems, for an update on using math and English performance data from high school transcripts (rather than have students self report) for AB 705 placement recommendations through Mt. SAC's Assessment Questionnaire system (link).

The Cabinet discussion focused on the K-12 data now being made available to the Chancellor's Office (Antonio is connecting with John Hadad Hadad, Product Manager, CCC Common Assessment Initiative) Also of concern is the continuing challenge to obtain that same transcript data through Cal-Pass Plus (link)—for which there are no outcomes yet.
