Be a successful language learner

Our primary goal at Mt. SAC ESL is to help our students successfully learn English to achieve their personal and professional goals. However, learning a new language can be challenging and overwhelming for adults with busy lives and many responsibilities. Thankfully, we offer a variety of in-person and online resources to provide you with all the support you need as you learn English.

Language Learning Center (LLC)

The LLC offers an open computer lab where students can use language learning software like Rosetta Stone, Mango Languages, and Native Accent. They also offer Self Directed Learning Activities (SDLAs) for students to complete independently and review with faculty tutors. Additionally, they host The Talks and Grammar Games to help students practice English in groups. The LLC is located next to Building 66 in Building 77-1005. TIME MANAGEMENT

WAYS TO USE TIME WISELY



Having good time management allows students to complete more in less time. Because when you have good time management your attention is focused and you are not wasting time on distractions. Having good time management skills also reduce stress and anxiety. Moreover, by using time efficiently, you will be able to complete your work on time, stay engaged in class and have more time to practice English and do other activities that you enjoy doing!

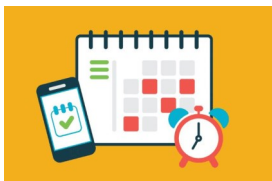
There are many ways you can improve your time management. Here are some ways we think that you might find useful and want to share them with you! Take a look at some tips we recommend you might want to use to improve your time management.

Have an agenda



Just like when we are little, we would write down our homework assignments and upcoming exams on the agenda to keep us on track of what needs to be done. Writing down everything not only lets us have a general overview of what needs to be done the day of but also provides a sense of achievement from completing your goals. Especially when you cross off items from your to-do list!

Create a master schedule



In addition to creating an agenda you can also assign time for your tasks, by blocking off chunks of time for study or assignment work. This will help you improve your sense of time and also help you visualize how you are spending your time. It is important to set time limits such as “finish level 3 homework by 4:00PM”. This prevents tasks eating into time you allocated for other activities. You could start by estimating how long each task will take and color coding different task with the colors you like!

WAYS TO USE TIME WISELY

Start assignments early



Do not leave assignments until the last minute. It is not only going to create more stress and anxiety, but you also may not have the best end product that you could have done if you had given yourself more time if you had done it carefully.

Avoid multi-tasking



Divided attention is an inefficient way to learn. Make sure to focus on a task at a time to maximize your productivity. Trying to do too many things at once can affect how well you do each task. Focus on one thing at a time. You will be glad you did!

Reduce distractions



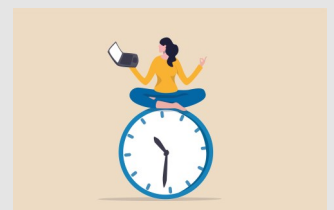
During scheduled work time make sure to put your phone away or put it on “do not disturb” mode. In addition, distraction can also come from internal feeling such as hunger, thirstiness or tiredness. Before you study make sure to not only put your phone away, but to also have everything you might need during your study ready to go, so you do not have to walk around anymore. Some things you should have by you water, snacks, computer charger(s), etc.

Take regular breaks



Working on something for too long can lead to lost of focus and tiredness. Make sure to take short breaks every half hour or so. This can help you recharge and let your eyes and brain take a break also. However, the tricky thing is to make sure you do not get side-tracked while on your short break and always return to studying when your alarm rings!

SHORT – TERM TRAINING

Pharmacy Technicians

Pharmacy Technicians work under the directions of a pharmacist. They perform the technical and non-judgmental functions and are responsible for inventory control.

Work Environment and Physical Demands

These are the physical activities and demands required during a typical workday.

- Indoors usually in pharmacies that are neat, clean, and well-organized
- Requires extreme care in handling and storing drugs and chemicals
- Work is considered physically light
- Reaching is needed to place materials on shelves
- Seeing is important in order to see small print on labels and boxes
- Some lifting and moving heavy boxes and delivery carts may be required

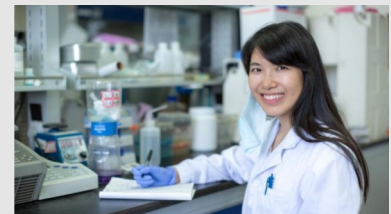
Personal Characteristics will aid you in being successful. These abilities may be natural and can be improved by using them.

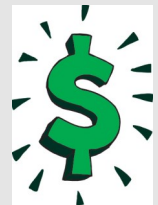

Deadline: March 17th 2023 by 12pm

The Mt. San Antonio College ESL Scholarship Committee would like to invite Level 4, 5, 6, & VESL students who are planning on taking Mt. SAC credit courses for Fall 2023 to apply for 1 of 3 \$500 scholarships.

Requirement for Applying

- Current Mt. SAC ESL student in level 4, 5, 6, or VESL.
OR
- Prior Mt. SAC ESL student with fewer than 6 units of credit.
AND
- Attended at least 70% of the semester and passed a Mt. SAC ESL Level class.
AND
- Planning and are eligible to attend credit class at Mt. SAC in the Fall semester.

Requirement on the Application

- Essay prompt that describes your:
 1. Educational and career goals.
 2. Potential for success in credit college classes.
 3. Obstacles you have overcome in becoming a successful student.
- Attended at least 70% of the semester and have completed a Mt. SAC ESL Level class.
- Two recommendations from Mt. SAC ESL teachers.
